

Course Syllabus

7/8 Economics

Course Description:

Economics is the study of how societies use their resources and the effects on the community. In this course, we will study many different areas of economics from entrepreneurship to investing to writing a resume. Students will learn life skills as well as how our economy started and where it currently is at. We discuss topics such as credit and debt; insurance; giving and stewardship; currency; and travel economics.
